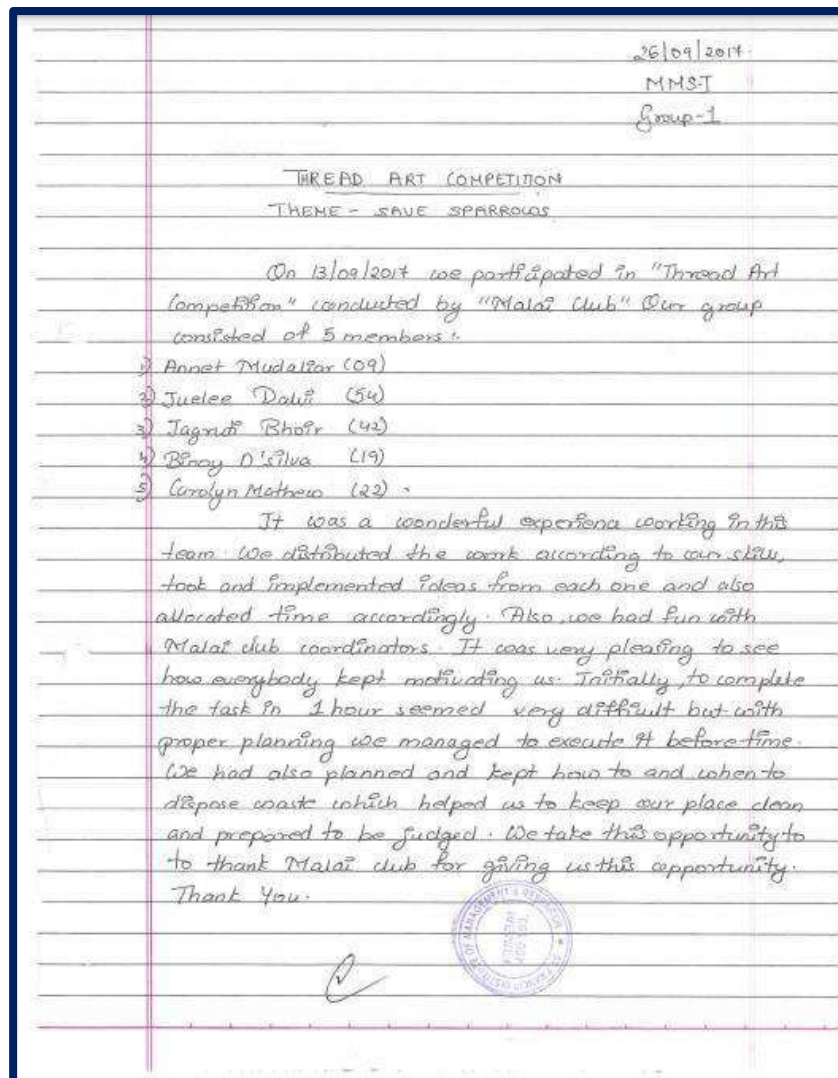

Today, vacuum cleaner is the most useful and a very common household cleaning tool that uses a suction mechanism to clean the dirt. In this instructable, we will learn how to make a powerful high rpm 12V DC motor, a plastic bottle and a propeller. This vacuum cleaner is equipped and a propeller. This vacuum cleaner is equipped with a separate dust container & since it is equipped with a plastic dust collector, it can also be modified to work as a wet & dry vacuum cleaner.

So, we decided to make a vacuum cleaner, air pressure fan and a motor fan from an empty decoupled into steel plates and motor from a broken remote control car. We had also used a empty bottle and a small waste cloth in order to separate dust and we also

used a cutter, glue.

Requirements:-

Bottle, wire, seo, motor, m-seal, hot glue gun, cutter, batteries, paint, tape and net cloth.

Steps:-

1. Take a small plastic bottle and make a hole in the bottle cap, such that it looks like a ring.
2. Using hot needle or soldering iron tip, make few holes in the bottle neck.
3. Choose the bottle tightly.
4. Take the large bottle and using a knife cut it into two pieces from the neck.
5. Using Araldite adhesive, paste the small bottle inside the neck of the large plastic bottle, such that the small bottle can be easily removed by unscrewing the bottle cap.

Learning:-

Work is not of one man job. With the help of team we made it with less time. A goal is more easily achievable with a well coordinated and supportive team than without one.


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Learning Outcomes
