

Report on Local Industrial Visit to Chandigarh- Shimla- Amritsar

Dates: 5/10/23- 12/10/23

#### **Introduction:**

St. Francis Institute of Management and Research organised a 6-nights, 7-days local Industrial visit for its students to explore the vibrant cities of Chandigarh, Shimla, and Amritsar. The journey aimed to provide students with a comprehensive learning experience, combining cultural immersion, historical exploration, industrial visits and personal development. 140 MMS students along with 11 Faculty and Staff Members trip was organised.

### **Description**:

#### 05/10/23

The trip commenced as students assembled at Mumbai Central Terminals (MMCT) by 10:00 hrs to board the 12925 Paschim Express, scheduled for departure at 11:25 hrs. The day was devoted to travelling by train, allowing students to observe the diverse landscapes and cultures of India. An enriching experience was provided as the group enjoyed an overnight journey with a packed dinner served on the train.

#### 06/10/23

Upon our arrival in Chandigarh at 4:00 pm the students were transferred to a hotel called Royal Park Resorts. In the evening students had leisure time for shopping in the local Shastri market in sector 22 facilitating an immersive cultural experience. The day concluded with dinner at the hotel and an overnight stay.

#### 07/10/23

After enjoying breakfast at the hotel, students checked out and embarked on an industrial visit. Students visited Inter Solar, where the manufacturing and assembling of solar panels were



shown and in Amulya Labs, ayurvedic medicines manufacturing process was demonstrated. Later after having lunch, in the evening around 4:00 pm the group explored the renowned Rock Garden and had a visit to picturesque Sukhna Lake. By 6:30 pm the journey group left for Shimla. Upon arrival around 12:45 am in Shimla, the group checked in at the hotel Himalayan Heights, where dinner was served, and an overnight stay awaited.
